

The Fremont County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Wednesday, June 3, 2026, in the Fremont County Courthouse Boardroom, with Dustin Sheldon and Jeff Shearer present. Clint Blackburn was not present for this meeting. A quorum was declared, and the meeting was officially called to order at 9:00 a.m. Minutes of the previous board session were read and approved. The agenda was approved as posted.

Let the records show that Recorder Tarah Berry was present at this meeting. County Attorney Peter Johnson joined the meeting at 9:05 a.m.

Conference Call with Page County BOS-Discuss/Action Johnson Run. Shearer talked with Page County Supervisor Todd Maher on the phone earlier in the week about the Johnson Run Drainage issue and discussed putting the drainage ditch project out for bids. Page County Supervisor Maher mentioned to Shearer that it is undercutting in a certain spot and it needs to be taken care of.

Motion by Sheldon to table Johnson Run action. Motion carried unanimously.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the signing of the following:

Motion by Shearer to allow Vice Chairman Sheldon to sign IDOT payment voucher with HGM Associates for engineering services for FM-CO36(83) - - 55-36 through 05/15/26 in the amount of \$19,835.54. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Shearer to change the meeting date for next week's meeting to Tuesday June 9th at 9:00 am to canvass the Primary Election. Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed board appointments for board of adjustment, tourism board, and the civil service commission. The auditors' office received one application for the board of adjustment. Motion by Shearer to appoint Travis Hensley to the Board of Adjustment effective till April 30th, 2030. Motion carried unanimously.

There were no applications for the tourism board and civil service commission positions that were due in the Auditor's office on May 26th. Motion by Shearer to post the two notices again for two weeks, with applications due June 17th by 4:00 pm. Motion carried out unanimously.

At 9:01 a.m., Election Deputy Jessica Richardson met with the board to canvass and certify the 2026 Primary Election. There was a total of 963 ballots cast. The following county candidates were nominated for the Republican Party: Board of Supervisors – Clint Blackburn and Dustin Sheldon; County Attorney – No candidate; County Recorder – Tarah Berry; Treasurer – Alise Snyder. The following candidates were nominated for the Democratic Party: Board of Supervisors – No candidates; County Recorder – No candidate; County Treasurer – No candidate; County Attorney – No candidate. Motion by Shearer to approve the results of the canvass. Motion carried unanimously. Let the records reflect these results as official.

At 9:05 a.m., Attorney Peter Johnson joined the meeting.

At 9:11 a.m., Deputy Auditor Cassie Gilbert joined the meeting.

Engineer Dan Davis met with the board for the signing of the following:

Motion by Sheldon to allow Chairman Blackburn to sign the work in ROW Permit for NEEA, Inc. to install part of a tile system under 280th Street between 405th Avenue and 410th Avenue. Motion carried unanimously.

Clark stated that she feels safe and secure; that is the way it is. She learned this from a former supervisor. Supervisor Todd Maher said they will talk to Shenandoah that they are to pay for anything in city limits. Supervisor Maher said he would like to make a clear designated path from here if something comes up in the future, so it is clearly in writing. Attorney Peter Johnson said he would talk to Rich Maher, who was the attorney on it years ago, to get refreshed on how it was laid out. Motion by Supervisor Maher for no levy for FY 26/27. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Sheldon for no levy for Johnson Run for FY 26/27. Motion carried unanimously.

In other business, a revised Recorder's Monthly Report for May and the Sheriff's Monthly Report were approved.

Claims were approved for June 12, 2026.
